INTERNAL RENOVATION PROJECT NEWS- I am sure most of you will have been wondering why there hasn't been any updates to do with our application to take out the pews, replace with chairs, and add a drinks servery and disabled access toilet/baby change.

The process of faculty approval through the Diocesan Advisory Committee and Diocesan Chancellor is almost at the stage where our proposals can be sent to the Deputy Chancellor for approval. The gap between the public consultation last summer and now has been because our Diocesan Registrar (Mrs Nadine Waldron) is dealing with all faculty applications in strict date order. Thus, we only got a letter from Mrs Waldron in early January informing us that we had had one objection submitted last August. The PCC at its January meeting then discussed our response to that objection and that letter was delivered to her on Monday. Ian Nicklin and I went through everything with Mrs Waldron on Monday afternoon.

In the meantime, the Chancellor, Judge Bullimore has asked his deputy, the Revd Tim Clarke (London) to consider our application. That may or may not require a visit to All Saints. Please keep this process in your prayers. Patience is one of the fruits of the Spirit! *Peter*
