MODERN DAY SLAVERY IN THE UK- There is a talk by the Medaille Trust on Wednesday 16th January at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish Centre, Mickleover at 7.30pm

The Medaille Trust was established by Roman Catholic religious orders to help women, men and dependent children who are victims of modern slavery in the UK, enabling them to regain their dignity and self-worth. They do this by providing safe housing and offering opportunities for physical and psychological healing and rehabilitation. The talk will address what is Modern Day Slavery in 21st Century Britain, the role of the safe house and what individuals/communities can do to prevent slavery. Everyone welcome.
